

# NATIONAL CHAIRMAN



In July/August of this year, I was overseas for 7 weeks holidaying with my wife, Cathy, in Greece (the home place of my parents) and Turkey; and then ministering in Accra, Ghana; Walhalla, USA and Toronto, Canada. This extended break gave time to reflect on the past 12 years of my spiritual journey, and particularly the opportunity and privilege the Lord has given me to be able to serve the CRC here in Australia.

nations. 'Adopt a Nation' is not just a catch cry, but is becoming a practical reality as we now are seeing so many Holy Spirit led, innovative and creative ministry and missionary expressions being undertaken by churches, individual pastors and leaders.

In my recent trip, I spent time in **Istanbul** with a beautiful family from our Blackwood Christian Family Centre church who are sowing themselves into Turkey, working with a Christian organisation to touch the lives of people there. There is another couple from one of our South Australian CRC churches that have sown themselves with another Christian organisation in **Morocco**. Just two families among many from our CRC Churches who are incarnating themselves in countries because Christ's love is compelling them to share the Good News about Jesus.

It's also heartening that the National Chairmen/Leaders of the nations where the CRC has an organisational presence, as well as other CRC Pastors who are personally pioneering in nations, are **meeting every year**, the week after our National Conferences/ Conventions. This important yearly gathering **is helping to build deep fellowship links as we work together** to implement the International Strategic Directions that we set every five years. Imagine the year 2095, celebrating the CRC's 150<sup>th</sup> – with an

organisational presence in EVERY nation of our planet, consisting of tens of thousands of churches and several million people! This is more than possible if we keep building our movement around Jesus' Great Commission and never deviate from our foremost priority to preach the Gospel to the whole world, to produce disciples who will go out to plant new **churches** that will become operational bases for further evangelism. This is what a book of Acts oriented New Testament movement is all about. If the CRC remains steadfast as a biblically based, cross focussed. Christ centred, Holy Spirit dependant, culturally sensitive, contemporary and people loving movement, we will always be a delight to our Heavenly Father and will continually be blessed by Him till Jesus returns.

## A Great Nation

Here in this nation of Australia that we all love, we have **transformed Ministry Recognition** into a competencybased approach with a personal coach/mentor for each candidate as they move from a Trainee Minister's credential, to a State Minister's credential with a celebrants licence and then to a National Minister's credential. Linked in with this is

our National College of Ministry that ensures that a top training program by our future ordained Ministers and lay leaders can be done in their own local church. The end result of **spiritually** grounded and highly skilled men and women who are called and gifted by God is being felt by all of us who have been around for long time in the CRC. The quality of our new ordained ministers is very impressive and they are doing a fantastic job in leading and planting churches and in being team pastors.

We now have an increasing number of churches that are heading to 500+ in size and many new churches have been planted. I recently ministered at Turning Point (Melbourne), a very healthy and growing (500+) church, ably led by Phil Cayzer, that has planted two new daughter churches with plans for several more in the years ahead. I pray that in the coming years we will have dozens of 500+ churches doing the same.

Sadly, some churches have needed to close, a few moved out, but the general cohesion of our movement has become

much stronger, as is evidenced in the more than doubling of our attendances at National Pastors & Leaders

Conferences, the success of our huge International People's Conventions; and that most of our pastors and leaders also meet in regions and at our yearly State Council/Conference events. These are signs of good health that bodes well for our future.

This relational health is reflected in our fabulous National Executive Team and the Strategic Teams they lead who all humbly serve the best interests of our movement here in Australia and throughout our CRC world. It is a pleasure to be closely associated with such a noble group of men and women of God who are cooperatively working together to strengthen all our churches and ministers and to enable us all to more effectively extend Jesus' Kingdom.

I visit all our State Conferences in the first half of each year and they are spiritual, yet fun events that are so well run by our very capable State Chairmen and their teams. The CRC is in a really healthy place throughout our land and

I so enjoy being part of each of these State gatherings.

### **A Joyous Service**

I've been reflecting on our collective progress because I had to seriously pray about accepting a nomination to stand as National Chairman for a fourth term. After consulting with the various leadership groups that I'm connected with and accountable to, it became clear I should make myself available to serve if our National Council so decides.

I have felt God's encouragement in this decision as I still have some significant work to do; and I do view it as a joyous service in spite of the burdens that can be quite weighty at times. ## A Great State Council!

Uniquely, our State Council covers more than half the Australian landmass! The tyranny of distance as such is particularly challenging for the West Australian and Northern Territory pastors and leaders. However it's been exciting to see numbers of them attend recent conferences. We continue to believe for the further enlargement in these frontiers of our CRC Movement. All up some 40 or so churches make up our State Council. Whilst the sizes of these churches may vary, it is great to see the respect, appreciation and egalitarian way in which our Movement continues to work together for the purpose of the Kingdom of God in our communities and states. It's a privilege to lead such a great cohort leaders, pastors and churches.

## **Growing Leadership**

The State Executive team continues on as from last year, being made up of Greg Crome, Fiona Voortman, Joe Habermehl, Paul Kidney, with David Bland and David Washington sitting in on a permanent basis. It has also been wonderful to have John Poyzer functioning as our State Minister and Vice Chairman this last year. In that role he particularly has moved amongst us bringing encouragement and support. Also appreciation is extended to Allan Cleanthous and David Bland who facilitate our training, credentialing and coaching processes. This last year has been significant, particularly in the number of new credentials that have been issued. Last year one International, six National Ministers, eleven Minister and seven Trainee Credentials were processed.

Succession of leadership remains one of the great challenges for this next decade. Many of our 'baby boomer' pastors are reaching retirement age and it is critical that we continue to equip emerging pastors and leaders. So it's been wonderful to see so many working through the credentialing pathways. This speaks well for the future of our State Council.

## State Gatherings

A great State Conference was held again this year in March at one of our key regional churches in Murray Bridge. The theme of the conference was 'Risk'! How wonderful to have two of our movement's great risktakers share, Pastors Barry Silverback and Barry Chant. They both model lifetimes of stepping out in God and taking 'Risk' with unerring faith!

Further, this year we again were privileged to hold a Trainee Pastors and Emerging Leaders weekend with over seventy in attendance and also a retreat for Pastors and Leaders. Both of these were facilitated by Pastor Robert Gallagher, visiting for the second successive year from the USA, and Pastor Vicki Gilchrist from NSW.

## Around the Churches

Whilst there have been challenges in certain churches both from governance and leadership points of view, overall our churches continue in good heart and strength. A new church has been planted in Salisbury, in the northern suburbs of Adelaide, and other planting initiatives are underway around the States. Pastor John Poyzer continued as State Minister to move around churches giving support and encouragement as needed.

It has been a pleasing year for the future. A Church plant at Koo Wee Rup under the Cranbourne church is going very well. We have also seen a successful amalgamation within Mildura with Vinelife and OneWay churches becoming OneVine Community Church. The Geelong church has received a new pastor in David Manning which we are excited about, and the Warrnambool church has been delighted with a former elder and pastor in Graeme Bradley succeeding Steve McNeilly. Phil Baker from Mount Gambier in SA also succeeds Peter Fleming at Hamilton. The Wyndham Vale church has also

proceeded to growth once again as it has come under Dan Parker and the team at Kingston City Church.

Credentials (subject to matters in train at the time of writing) saw five new Trainee Ministers, one Minister and two (and perhaps three) Affiliate Minister Credentials added. There were also four who progressed to Minister, one to Specialist Minister –Pastor (Canada), and one to National Credential (pending at the time of writing).

The Koo Wee Rup and Maryborough churches have new meeting venues. Our generational and regional connectedness improved over this year with well supported gatherings for mutual benefit. This bodes well for the future of the State.

David Wagner and John Mellor ministered at the "iAM Revival" State Conference who were fortunately both available in Melbourne that week. Their unique and different ministries were a great encouragement to the region and the state. Likewise all the CRC ministers present were remarkable and everyone went home to carry revival in many different ways.

Our Executive was confirmed at our Annual General Meeting as follows;

Vice Chairman- Dan Parker Secretary/Treasurer- Stephen Holt, Members- Phil Tong, Matthew Wyatt and Rob Nyhuis. In addition, Chris Carmody was added to the continuing Executive. We are very pleased with the cross section of our State and the cross section of experience and age represented on the Executive.

On a personal level, I flagged last year that my service as State Chairman would most likely conclude at the end of 2015. # NATIONAL MISSIONS



We are steadily moving toward fulfilling our vision of 'A presence in every nation by 2045'.

A recent survey of our Australian CRC churches with returns from 100 of 116 churches shows that 88 are involved in global missions, plus three others would be involved through their mother church. Hence 90 churches or 91% are involved in global missions.

These churches are involved in a total of 65 nations, plus Australia and New Zealand, totalling 67 nations.

37 nations (57%) are visited regularly, 12 (19%) visited occasionally, 10 (15%) have been adopted but not visited yet and 6 nations (9%) receive money but not visits from our Australian CRC Churches. This is an increase since 2012 of 25 new nations, less 8 nations no longer connected with CRC Churches. This equals a net increase of 17 nations in 2 years.

The countries receiving the most regular visits from Australian CRC churches are India (16 churches visiting), Philippines (13 churches visiting), Kenya (10 churches visiting), PNG (10 churches visiting), and Sri Lanka (8 churches visiting).

The accompanying chart "Countries by Number of Churches Involved" shows the diversity around the globe of the nations we are reaching as well as the number of churches involved with each nation. For the size of our movement in Australia the breadth of our global missions involvement is highly commendable.

As we are expanding into many nations we introduced the concept of recognising Affiliate and Member churches that are linked to a sponsoring church in a CRC member nation (see Missions Policy 2.0, which is available on the crcchurches.org website). This recognition will continue until a National CRC Movement is established in these nations.

So far 'Jesus Christ Inheritance Church' in Moung Russey, Cambodia, with Ps Sem Sophal has been recognised as an Affiliate church sponsored by South Eastern Christian Centre, Endeavour Hills in Victoria. They are proudly displaying their certificate in the church.

'True North CRC Churches International Society' in Canada, with Ps Jay & Maco Hontiveros has been issued with recognition as a Member church sponsored by Diggerland in Red Cliffs, Victoria.

'Kenya CRC Churches' in Njora Kenya with Ps John & Mercy Masika is being issued a Member church certificate sponsored by the 'Church at Archie's Creek', Wonthaggi in Victoria.

Missions Policy 2.1 on the role of field facilitators was published this year. Also the finance policy (policy 3.0) was updated in February 2014 to include further options for churches in sending money overseas, and to safeguard it from ending up in terrorist hands, which is a government requirement.

There was a great response from our churches to give assistance to the victims of the super typhoon Haiyan/

Yolanda which devastated large areas of central Philippines in November 2013. Over \$80,000 was donated by our churches. Pastor Allan Manzanilla, the CRC Philippines National leader and Visayan Regional leader, together with his team, did an excellent job in helping people practically as well as sharing the hope there is in Jesus Christ.

Our three Movement-wide projects, Walhalla USA, Colombo Project and medical costs arising from Nathan Poloso's illness are all continuing to make good progress.

Ps Graeme and Moya Enright are doing a fantastic job in reviving the church in Walhalla in South Carolina and progressing toward the vision of training and sending missionaries to Central and South America. There is an ongoing need for financial support for this great cause.

The land has been fully paid for in Colombo and we are not far short of having \$100,000 cash in hand which is needed to get the detailed plans and permits for the project.

All commitments made last year toward Nathan Poloso's medical costs have been met. This now leaves a balance of \$135,000 outstanding on Nathan's expenses.

We greatly appreciate the generosity of our churches and people to all the areas of global mission involvement that we as a Movement are doing.

Since tax deductibility is no longer available on the ministry in Sri Lanka, the support for the Children's Home and associated ministries has dropped considerably. Within the next year this could lead to some serious implications if support is not increased.

A number of children are returning to their families or relatives and other options are being explored to give assistance as is appropriate. Also a great thank you to Katelyn Fowler who has been the editor of PULSE magazine. Furthermore, I wish to thank the members of the International Missions Strategy Team, Ps Barry Silverback, Ps Bill Vasilakis, Ps Neil Milne, Ps Mike Groom, Ps Bruce Sharman and myself for their experience and wisdom being contributed to CRC Missions.

## NTERNATIONAL MISSIONS



In the last year we have seen an increased interest in missions in all of our local churches here in Australia and beyond with a willingness to search out what opportunities there might be for engaging in the nations in some way. This is encouraging to see these signs of interest and enthusiasm.

Also there has been a continuing ministry into the leaders of the different nations by a number of different pastors from Australia and New Zealand and I personally have had significant time inputting into the lives in quite a number of different nations that I have visited.

The erecting of a brand new church building in Bethel Suva in Fiji through the efforts of the Kingston Community Church along with the Fijian people is a very significant achievement and is a prominent landmark on the main highway in that suburb of the city. It will prove a great incentive for the ministry in that nation.

There has been continued input into Cambodia and leadership schools conducted there.

The opportunities for growing expansion of the ministry in Africa

seem to be everywhere and many invitations are coming from that continent.

The Ministry in Walhalla, South Carolina, USA is very encouraging and the spiritual healing and growth of the church there is very evident by the spirit of peace, unity and the anticipation for the future is a great encouragement to view. It seems that they are positioning themselves for advancement into the nations. The Faith Christian School is growing and is in good heart and also shares the same anticipation for future that the church has.

Another exciting thing to witness is the rise of a new spirit of evangelism in the churches in the Philippines.

Local churches and particularly the young people of that nation are seeing a grass route movement of enthusiasm to share their faith with others. There are some churches beginning to see miracles of healing amongst them which is very exciting to witness and be aware of.

There are places in Asia and the Pacific which are showing a much greater interest in missions and to actively engage in training for missionary service. There are plans in their final stages for the creating of pathways in missions, missionary training and service for local churches in several countries in Asia and the Pacific. This will enable local churches to partner together in training and sending out their own missionaries into the nations.

I know that there are different churches and pastors in Australia and

New Zealand who have intentions to pursue new nations in Europe and Central and Latin America and it will be interesting to see where this will all lead to in the next year or more.

We have seen the enlargement of a mentoring program for young men and women with the inclusion of another country where a theme is set with studies. I personally interact with them electronically to be assured that the principals of ministry have been understood and adopted into their thinking life so as to guide them into the future.

In the past year there has been much work done in ministering to establishing of new operational bases for pioneering which all have local churches within them. They are called operational bases and not local churches for the purpose of reinforcing their mandate which is to birth other churches through their evangelistic and pioneering efforts; mobilising the local church members within the base to actively engage and partner. This 'grows' them also.

There are many finding salvation through Christ and deliverance from demonic bondages as a result of personal evangelism; one to one encounters. Our Indian brothers and sisters are very aggressive in their efforts to share the gospel with others and to pray for them.

We have our first Indian missionary in training and a second one in the process of entering training in Papua New Guinea. We will see our second Indonesian missionary going to India soon and our first Burmese missionary from Burma into another country in Asia or the Pacific.

### INTERNATIONAL MISSIONS CONT.

Our goal for Asia and the Americas is training and the eventual mobilising of people into the nations of the world.

Life is indeed exciting and what an adventurous journey it is to walk with Jesus in His global cause and purposes. Amazing opportunities are before us but it will take courageous men and women who will stand up and take possession of those opportunities.

That is why the words of Caleb are so relevant for us today in our CRC movement; "Give me this mountain".

This was the demand of Caleb when he entered the Canaan Land (Joshua 14).

Do we dare like Caleb dared to claim what was promised to him by God?

Do we ever say "Give me this mountain," referring some aspect of future goal, objective or burning passion that we have in our lives?

How many good purposes and Godly desires have been lost, hindered or never aspired to for lack of an audacious faith which grasps hold of it?

Dare we say "Give me the Nations?" "Ask of me, and I will make the nations your inheritance, the ends of the earth your possession" (Psalms 2:8 NIV).

Do we dare say "give me this nation or this city, this town or this people?"

An audacious faith, which demands what God has promised is what is required to possess our possessions. Caleb was committed to possessing what God had promised him. He knew what belonged to him; what was his by divine right. He was audacious enough to demand what had been promised to him. This kind of bold faith demands, it does not ask or waits for time, circumstances to produce.

God creates opportunities and sometimes circumstances and events in life produce opportunities; and sometimes opportunities are made or created by those who seek to do so. However, all must be seized, or taken hold of if they are to lead to something worthwhile for the Kingdom.

What is needed to reach and touch the nations are courageous men and women with courageous faith. Courageousness is faith in action. Courageous people create opportunities even when they are not obvious or apparent to others. Courageous people search for opportunities to give expression to the great commission, pushing the parameters and applying pressure on those things which seek to turn them aside.

Courageous people seize opportunities. They seize even the smallest opportunity and seek to make the most of it, always hoping that it will lead to some wider and bigger. Courageous people 'go through' open doors not knowing what to expect but adventurously continuing on.

Courageous people seek to 'push' the boundaries that seek to restrict, confine, hinder and prevent. They put pressure on the gates of the enemy and of hell.

This is the kind of men and women that will challenge the enemy and challenge his rule, and execute the summons of judgment pronounced by the triumphant Christ.

These are the kind of men and women (young and old) who claim the promises, show righteousness and subdue those kingdoms of sin and inequality. Like the heavenly beings in the vision of the prophet Ezekiel; never turning or deviating from their task but 'went straight forward'; in spite of the obstacles or opposition (Ezekiel 1.8).

Nations are won, not mandated to us.

They are fought for and not just inherited.

They are taken, by courageous forceful men and women who reflect that great heart of our 'warrior captain', Jesus.

These are the kind of people who will demand 'Give me the nations'.

May we in the CRC pray for men and women who are already among us that they might arise and engage in courageous living and adventure for the Kingdom of God and the cause of Christ.

In all nine areas, a National Executive member or a key CRC Leader has been appointed to 'champion' their area. The champions (in order of goal area) are Ian Miller, Bill Vasilakis, Peter Gillard, Bruce Sharman, Mike Cronin, Rob Nyhuis, David Wright, Tim Lochens, Caroline Dennis and Mike Groom. These 'champions' have or are in the process of compiling a team of Godgifted team members to help them in their task.

These nine teams have started the process of meeting and working to start bringing these goals and the thirty strategies that form the body of the SD 2013-18 to fruition.

As National Administrator my role is to support the National Executive team through tracking progress and helping administratively as needed. It has been a useful exercise to compile our 'baseline' statistics during the second half of 2013. We thus have a record of our starting point and will better be able to ascertain if progress is being made, at least numerically.

I look forward to continuing to work with our National leaders, and with all the pastors in our Australian churches, as together we strive to achieve these goals, and as a consequence extend the reach of God's Kingdom throughout Australia and the whole world.





#### AUDIT REPORT

#### **CRC College of Ministry Audit Scope**
